

Future episodes to be released include:


- 12th August Annette Kimitei, who is a leading security expert in Kenya

Scam warnings following global Microsoft outage

Cybersecurity experts have issued scam warnings to consumers and businesses due to attempts to exploit vulnerabilities following the global Microsoft outage on Friday, 19th July. The outage, triggered by a software update from cybersecurity firm CrowdStrike, affected 8.5 million computers. The scams include:

Release of malicious codes purportedly to recover systems
Phone calls from individuals pretending to be from CrowdStrike 'Support' or 'Security'
Phishing emails from alleged technical experts
Fake website domains offering supposed 'security patches' for the incident

Significant increase in fraudulent insurance claims

The UK insurance company Aviva has reported a major increase in fraudulent insurance claims for the first half of 2024. They state:

- 39% increase in the number of fraudulent claims
- 11,000 suspect claims valued at £116 million
- An average of 30 bogus claims daily worth £318,000
- A third of fraudulent claims related to motor injury and a third of those from 'crash-to-cash' schemes
- A further 13,100 claims are being investigated for potential fraud

The insurer attributes the spike to the economic strain on individuals, prompting some to exploit insurance for financial gain.
