

# **Latest Security Thought Leadership Podcasts**

Annette Kimitei is Managing Director of one of the major security suppliers in Kenay and has been active in security associations including Kenya Private Sector Alliance (KEPSA) and Women in Safety Excellence (WISE) where she has led the case for improved conditions, higher standards and greater diversity (amongst other things) in the security sector. Annette is a multi-award winner including as an individual, an OSPA for 'Outstanding Security Director', and for her company, 'Outstanding Contract Security Company'. In this interview, she discusses:

- her experience as a woman in a male-dominated profession
- the impact of Kenyan culture on women working in the security sector
- how she has been part of a movement to challenge this by reimagining roles and rethinking security practices
- the weaknesses in regulation in Kenya and how they are being overcome

Professor Levi has an international reputation for excellence in researching various aspects of economic crime and has received numerous major lifetime achievement awards, including from the Tackling Economic Crime Awards. In this interview, he discusses:

- the influence of his first book *The Phantom Capitalists* published in 1981
- why the response to money laundering has been misguided
- how efforts to reclaim proceeds from criminals have underachieved
- why so many fraud cases have failed, and where we should look for remedies.

## Research to improve the image of the security sector

The Security Research Initiative (SRI) is entering its twentieth year. For 2024-25, Perpetuity Research will be focusing on what is needed to improve the perception of the work of security professionals. Despite a growing body of evidence supporting the professionalisation, essential nature, and value of security, the sector continues to struggle with an image problem. This issue has numerous consequences, including difficulties with recruitment and retention, lack of status and investment within organisations, and being overlooked as a key partner in public protection.

The aim of the research is to:

- take stock of the strategies used to change perceptions of a sector/role
- establish what can be learned from initiatives that have been launched within security;
- understand the factors that security professionals believe can contribute to improving and communicating a better image.

The project will include desk-top research, interviews with specialists and a survey of security professionals. If you would like to share any thoughts on the topic, <u>please get in touch.</u>

# New book on tackling crime and disorder published

The latest book in the Crime Prevention and Security Management Series, edited by Professor Martin Gill, is now available. *Preventing Crime and Disorder in Public Places: Blending Opportunity Reduction, Guardianship, and Welfare* by Tim Prenzler, published by Palgrave Macmillan, stands out for its practical approach. As the author notes, the book is presented as "a readily accessible guide that combines theoretical insights with 'doable' strategies that can be applied by responsible parties on their home turf."

The book covers several pressing issues, including chapters on topics such as designing out crime and how these principles can be used to develop crime prevention approaches, security patrols partnering with police and other agencies, how improvements in local amenities can help tackle social exclusion, and better management of public gatherings. The book culminates in a discussion of a four-step model to guide the design and implementation of intervention programs. Each chapter is easy to follow and provides a solid evidence base for policy. The National Police Chiefs' Council (NPCC) has released its first national <u>analysis of the scale of violence against women and girls (VAWG)</u>, revealing the epidemic level of offending. The report highlights the following key points:

**Rising Offences**: VAWG is not only increasing, but the types of offences are becoming more complex, causing significant harm to victims and society.

Staggering Statistics: It is estimated that 1 in 20 people are perpetrators of VAWG each year, with the actual number likely much higher.

**Need for a Whole-System Approach**: Police chiefs stress that law enforcement alone cannot address this issue; a collaborative response involving criminal justice partners, government bodies, and other sectors is essential.

Perpetuity is actively engaged in combating VAWG. We regularly collaborate with police forces and office of police crime commissioners to improve responses and support services for survivors. We also:

Assist police forces in evaluating the impact of partnerships with third-sector organisations. Conduct research for Women's Centres to assess the effectiveness of trauma recovery therapies.

#### Did you know? - Bottles of water helped diffuse a security incident

During a recent podcast interview with Professor Martin Gill, Annette Kimitei, Managing Director of one of Kenya's major security suppliers, shared a compelling incident where security personnel providing protesters with bottles of water helped defuse a potentially volatile situation. The water, seen as a peace offering, allowed protesters to wash tear gas from their eyes and rehydrate after hours on the streets with limited access to refreshments. This simple gesture was well-received by the protesters, calming them down and increasing the likelihood that they would move on peacefully without further conflict.
