
#### **Inaugural Global OSPAs Winners Announced**

This year's OSPAs awards ceremony, proudly sponsored by <u>Axon</u>, took place on 20th February 2025 at the Royal Lancaster London. Hosted by renowned magician Ben Hanlin, 600 security professionals gathered for an evening of celebration and recognition, honouring outstanding performers in the sector. Founded on strong ethical principles, the awards are actively supported by numerous key industry bodies and special interest groups. These organisations nominate judges to represent them, including ADS, ASC, ASIS, ATMIA, AUCSO, BSIA, COLCPA, the City Security Council, CSSC, CSyP, DISA, the Food & Drink Association, IFPO, IPSA, ISACA, ISMA, NAHS, NSI, the Police & Security Group Initiative, PSSA, SIA, SIF, Skills for Security, SSAIB, SASIG, SyI, TiNYg, True Honour, the Women's Security Society, and the UK Security Commonwealth.

The OSPAs were preceded by a security Thought Leadership Summit (TLS) in the afternoon attended by over 130 leading security professionals. They heard from a number of innovative and challenging speakers on topics including forging the future through evolution, innovation, and trust; resetting the security value for the C-suites; the use of Al in security; the role of HMRC in ensuring the security sector is compliant; and how to break down barriers to security skills development. A panel discussion was held to explore how to maximise security for public benefit, and the popular annual 'What the bosses say' session delved into the challenges currently facing the security sector.
