### Police forces 'fail to respond' to 71% of serious retail crime

The police have responded to criticism that they aren't taking retail crime seriously enough by calling for greater cooperation with the retail sector to gather intelligence and secure convictions. A Freedom of Information (FOI) request by Co-op Foods found that police forces failed to respond to 71% of serious retail crime reports, and the Association of Convenience Stores (ACS) claims that police are not taking retail crime seriously.

Meanwhile, the BBC reports that private policing is booming in London as more business improvement districts (BIDs) sign up for services such as My Local Bobby to back-fill for police who, they say, aren't responding to shoplifting incidents.

**What do you think:** What is to blame for lack of police response, government funding or police prioritisation of crime? Are frontline police officers equipped with the right skills and tech to respond to retail crime? Does the use of private security personnel to 'back fill' police patrols undermine policing or support it, and does it create a divide between the 'haves' and the 'have-nots'?

## Nagging or nudging: security prompts create friction

Users of Google's Gmail are being nagged to activate Enhanced Safe Browsing which persist even after they have been acknowledged. This means you can click 'no thanks', but Google will keep asking. Concerns about Enhanced Safe Browsing have been raised by tech journalists at Bleeping Computer who also point out that this feature temporarily associates your browsing history with your Google account which can result in a loss of privacy.

Meanwhile, an article in the August edition of Professional Security follows on the same theme with a report from a recent meeting of [SASIG](#) which featured a presentation by Charlie Sinclair, cyber awareness and engagement manager at Unilever, and Tim Ward from Think Cyber.

They critique what has now become the de facto standard for cyber security training: the annual refresher course (which staff quickly forget), testing staff with phishing emails and mandatory training for those who fail the test. This, they say, simply alienates people against security, and they argue for a more consistent, persistent approach, full of gentle nudges to do the right thing.

**What do you think:** Should we nag users to do the right thing or does it encourage resistance to security in general? When does nudging turn into nagging? And how far should we go in trying to prevent users from making mistakes?

## Police claim independent research demonstrates facial recognition technology is fair, legitimate and proportionate

The Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) and South Wales Police (SWP) say that recent research results justify the continued use of facial-recognition technologies. The research published by the National Physical Laboratory (NPL) found there is "no statistical significance between demographic performance" if certain settings are used. This is an attempt to address previous concerns and criticisms regarding false positives and biases in facial recognition.

## Amazon's Ring cameras were used to spy on customers

Amazon Ring employees were able to access customer video without restrictions even when it wasn't necessary for their jobs. This included the ability to download videos and save and share them, up until the company took steps to block this, according to a complaint by the US Federal Trade Commission.
